Guidelines for Grant Seekers April 2020

The APi Group Foundation (the “Foundation”) has been established to provide financial support to organizations that are classified by the Internal Revenue Service as tax exempt as an organization described in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Geographic Focus

The principal focus of the Foundation includes those communities in Minnesota and other geographies where APi Group, Inc. and its subsidiaries have a significant business presence.

Eligibility

The Foundation awards grants to projects and activities creating measurable impact in four major fields of interest:

- **Health & Human Services** – Initiatives and programs that help individuals and families struggling to meet the challenges of everyday living, including struggles with health, hunger, poverty, domestic violence, homelessness and disabilities. Projects and programs impacting children and veterans are a particular area of interest for the Foundation.
- **Community, Civic and Cultural Development** – Programs and projects that focus on economic and cultural development at the local, regional or statewide level, including efforts that increase awareness of culture and the arts and encourage their growth, particularly for regions or populations that would otherwise be unable to participate.
- **Education** - Education initiatives and programs that primarily support secondary schools and schools of higher learning with special interest in curricula and capital improvements in the study of business, economics, engineering and natural/physical sciences, and the industrial trades as they relate to the safety, specialty contractor, and industrial services industries.

- **Environment** - Programs that emphasize sustainability, preservation, environmental education and stewardship of our communities' land, water and air with an emphasis on collaborative programs that strengthen ties between businesses and communities.

The Foundation will consider requests from qualified organizations to support operating budgets and capital fund programs for the construction, refurbishment or purchase of buildings, structures, equipment or physical enhancements. Normally, the Foundation will not contribute to such activities.

Limitations

The Foundation does not support the following:

- individuals
- individual scholarships
- individual sponsorships related to fund-raising
- organizations that are not described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code including, but not limited to:
 - labor or veteran's organizations
 - fraternal orders
 - social clubs
 - loans for small business
 - political organizations and political campaigns
- organizations that practice discrimination based on sex, age, height, weight, marital status, race, religion, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, disability, handicap, or veteran status
- religious organizations when the contribution will be used for denominational or sectarian purposes
- debt reduction campaigns
- sports tournaments
- talent or beauty contests

The Foundation does not purchase tickets or make payments to events or celebrations to raise funds for charitable purposes, nor does it sponsor advertising supporting these efforts.
